

Background on the Gospel

Reflection for May 12, 2024

Jesus started preparing us for his ascension in the readings of the past Sundays. In the fourth Sunday of Easter, he called us to be good shepherds to keep his flock and in fifth Sunday, he invited us to remain in him as branches to bear fruit while in the sixth Sunday, he reminded us to remain in his love as He remains in His father's love. With these common expressions Jesus was planning for His physical departure from us while telling us what to do after He is gone.

The readings of today describe the Ascension of the Lord Jesus into his Heavenly glory after promising his disciples to receive the Holy Spirit as their source of Heavenly power and commanding them to bear witness to him throughout the world by their lives and preaching. Today is Jesus' final glorification after his suffering, death, and Resurrection – a glory in which we, too, hope to share.

In the first reading St. Luke tells us that Jesus began his departure by instructing his apostles to remain in Jerusalem and wait for the baptism by the Holy Spirit. This baptism would make them to become His witnesses throughout the world by the power of the Holy Spirit. Here again we hear the word 'remain' in Jerusalem which echoes his previous expression of "remain in me" and "remain in my love." Jesus is not abandoning us but telling us that He will still be with us through the presence of the Holy Spirit. Today we meet Him in the Sacraments, ecclesial movements, in sharing our lives with others, in the scriptures and in the different gifts of the Holy Spirit poured on us as charisms.

St. Paul assures us in the second reading that one day, we, too, will be ascending to Heavenly Glory, provided we fulfill the mission entrusted to us by the ascending Lord. It is now up to us to do our part to attain the same glory of the Lord. We are called to preach the love of God with words and proclaim it with our lives. Let us ask the guidance of the Holy Spirit, as we bear witness to Jesus by our transparent Christian lives.

The gospel is now preached not by Jesus, not by the Holy Spirit, not by anyone but human beings like you and I who dedicate themselves to become instruments of the Holy Spirit, and instruments of the Word of God, and instruments of the healing and salvation of mankind. With the help of the Holy Spirit. Jesus invites us to make disciples of all nations and become signs of hope for each other.

Jesús comenzó a prepararnos para su ascensión en las lecturas de los domingos pasados. En el cuarto domingo de Pascua nos llamó a ser buenos pastores para guardar su rebaño y en el quinto domingo nos invitó a permanecer en él como ramas para dar fruto mientras que en el sexto domingo nos recordó a permanecer en su amor como Él permanece en el amor de su padre. Con estas expresiones comunes, Jesús estaba planeando Su partida física de nosotros mientras nos decía qué hacer después de que Él se haya ido.

Las lecturas de hoy describen la Ascensión del Señor Jesús a su gloria celestial después de prometer a sus discípulos recibir el Espíritu Santo como fuente de poder celestial y ordenarles que dieran testimonio de él en todo el mundo con sus vidas y predicaciones. Hoy es la glorificación final de Jesús después de su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección, una gloria que nosotros también esperamos compartir.

En la primera lectura San Lucas nos dice que Jesús comenzó su partida instruyendo a sus apóstoles a permanecer en Jerusalén y esperar el bautismo del Espíritu Santo. Este bautismo los haría convertirse en sus testigos en todo el mundo por el poder del Espíritu Santo. Aquí nuevamente escuchamos la palabra "permanecer" en Jerusalén, que hace eco de su expresión anterior de "permanecer en mí" y "permanecer en mi amor". Jesús no nos abandona sino que nos dice que todavía estará con nosotros a través de la presencia del Espíritu Santo. Hoy lo encontramos en los Sacramentos, en los movimientos eclesiales, en el compartir nuestra vida con los demás, en las Escrituras y en los diferentes dones del Espíritu Santo derramados sobre nosotros como carismas.

San Pablo nos asegura en la segunda lectura que un día también nosotros ascenderemos a la Gloria Celestial, siempre que cumplamos la misión que nos ha confiado el Señor ascendente. Ahora nos toca a nosotros hacer nuestra parte para alcanzar la misma gloria del Señor. Estamos llamados a predicar el amor de Dios con palabras y proclamarlo con nuestra vida. Pidamos la guía del Espíritu Santo, mientras damos testimonio de Jesús con nuestra transparente vida cristiana.

El evangelio ahora no es predicado por Jesús, ni por el Espíritu Santo, ni por nadie más que por seres humanos como tú y yo, que nos dedicamos a convertirnos en instrumentos del Espíritu Santo, e instrumentos de la Palabra de Dios, e instrumentos de sanación y salvación de la humanidad. Con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo. Jesús nos invita a hacer discípulos de todas las naciones y convertirnos en signos de esperanza unos para otros.
