

Counsel

Counsel, or right judgment, is one of the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. This gift, or grace, helps a person sense the moral truth about how to live. The gift of counsel is the ability to judge correctly the daily activity of our lives according to God's will. The source of this gift is the Holy Spirit, who empowers us to form our consciences properly.

THE CHURCH FOLLOWS JESUS

Saint Benedict and Saint Scholastica


Christians need one another to live the Gospel. Saint Benedict lived in Nursia, Italy, from A.D. 480 to 547. He wrote a rule of life that spelled out a clear way to live the Gospel in a monastic setting. A monastery is a place where a group of religious people lives and works together under a common set of rules. The Rule of St. Benedict is based on a life of peace as one works and prays in imitation of Christ.

Benedict's rules were so helpful that people came from many places to live together and follow them. Saint Scholastica (A.D. 480–543), Benedict's twin sister, was the first woman to choose to follow his rule of life. Soon other women came to live together to follow the same rules.

The followers of Saint Benedict and Saint Scholastica are baptized Christians who consecrate their lives to God. They are known as Benedictines. According to the rules, Benedictines are led by an abbot (for male communities) or a prioress (for female communities). The leader, guided by the Holy Spirit, is responsible for counseling the members on how to live a Christian life.

The Holy Spirit guided Benedict in his own personal life and empowered him to establish his set of rules through the gift of counsel or right judgment. With the aid of the Rule of St. Benedict, Benedictines today live as disciples of Christ.

The Holy Spirit at Work

In the New Testament, there are four written accounts of the Gospel. They are the **Gospels** according to Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, each passes on the faith of the Church in Jesus Christ and in the saving events of the Paschal Mystery. Each announces the Good News of Salvation in Jesus, who is the Lord and Savior of the world.

The four Gospels formed over three different stages. The first stage belongs to the very words and deeds of Jesus. The second stage belongs to the time of the Apostles' preaching about Jesus after the Holy Spirit descended upon them at **Pentecost**. The third stage belongs to the four Evangelists—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, each Evangelist, a name that means "announcer of good news," wrote his account of the Gospel that the Apostles had passed on about Jesus.

Each of the four accounts of the Gospel passes on the faith of the Church in Jesus from four individual perspectives:

Matthew pays special attention to the rich Jewish heritage of the Church and to the great teachings of Jesus.

Mark emphasizes what it means to be a disciple of Jesus and to walk with him toward the Cross.

Luke shows how Salvation in Jesus embraces all people, especially those who are most in need.

John reflects on the inner meaning of Jesus' words and deeds and writes in a very poetic style.

FAITH VOCABULARY

charism

A charism is a grace of the Holy Spirit given to build up the Church and to help the Church fulfill her work in the world.

Gospels

The Gospels are the first four books of the New Testament that pass on the faith of the Church in Jesus Christ and in the saving events of the Paschal Mystery.

Pentecost

Pentecost is the liturgical feast and holy day when the Church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit on the disciples and the birth of the Church.



The Spiritans

The Spiritans, or the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, is a religious community of priests and lay brothers approved by the Church. Guided by the unifying presence of the Holy Spirit, Spiritans seek to transform the hearts and minds of those who suffer. Their **charism**, or special gift, is bringing hope and compassion to those in need among the culturally diverse.



The Age of the Spirit

After his Resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples and promised to send the Holy Spirit to guide them and to be their advocate, or helper (read Luke 24:48–49; Acts 1:4–5).

Fifty days after Jesus rose from the dead, the Holy Spirit came to the disciples as promised. This was during the Jewish feast of Pentecost, a time to celebrate God's blessings (read Acts 2:1–4). Filled with enthusiasm, Peter the Apostle and the other disciples went into the streets of Jerusalem. There Peter boldly proclaimed the Gospel. People who had come to Jerusalem from many countries to celebrate the Jewish feast of Pentecost listened to Peter and heard him in their own language. Moved by the Holy Spirit, thousands were baptized (read Acts 1:14–41).

When Christians think of the Holy Spirit, we might think that the Holy Spirit waited until Pentecost to begin working among the People of God. The truth is that the Holy Spirit has always been at work in the world. We read about the Holy Spirit in the story of creation (see Genesis 2:7; Psalm 104:30),

and with the prophets of the Old Testament (see Zechariah 4:5–6). We also read about the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of Mary and all of the disciples.

The Holy Spirit was always with Jesus, the Son of God. When he began his public ministry, Jesus announced in the synagogue at Nazareth,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me."

LUKE 4:18

The mission of Jesus, the Son of God, and the Holy Spirit always go together. The Holy Trinity always works together. The Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit cannot be separated.

Today on Pentecost, we celebrate the beginning of the work that Jesus commissioned the Church to do (read Matthew 28:16–20). The Church is a sign and instrument of God's communion with all humanity and a sign in the world of the unity of the whole human race. God's promise made to Abraham came true in Christ. The Holy Spirit inspires the Church to boldly proclaim the Gospel.

In what ways can the Holy Spirit help you in your daily life?

Temple of the Holy Spirit

The Gospel of John tells us that when the crucified Jesus saw his mother and the disciple he loved standing by the Cross, he said,

" 'Woman, behold, your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother.' "

JOHN 19:26-27

The "beloved disciple" who is at the foot of the Cross stands for all who are Jesus' disciples. Mary, the Mother of God, is the mother of all who follow her Son, Jesus. Mary is the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church, the Body of Christ.

Mary is the first among all followers of Jesus. She was truly a temple of the Holy Spirit. We praise her as blessed among all women because of the fruit of her womb, Jesus. The Holy Spirit is always with her (see Luke 1:35).

What does it mean to say Mary is a "temple of the Holy Spirit"?

In his first Letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul asks the Christian community in Corinth,

"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God?"

1 CORINTHIANS 6:19

The Holy Spirit dwells within each of the baptized and within the whole Church. The Church is the Temple of the Holy Spirit.




